As this year's recipient of the Broken Arrow Award, I couldn't help but notice all of the envious looks from those in attendance. So as a service to the membership I thought that I would share the secrets that enabled me to receive this prestigious award.

Anyway, a tentative events schedule has been worked out, and should appear elsewhere in this Signals, and on the web site. You will note that there is only one actual contest (the Annual Scale event), all the rest are non-contest low-key fun events. If possible there will be food & refreshments at all of the events this year (depending of course on the turnouts at the events). It is our hope to create a more social atmosphere at the field this season, and less of a competitive one.

The Silver Springs day (Lyon County Fly-In at Silver Springs, May 17th) this year is themed "Kids In Aviation". A great chance to interest some more youngsters in RC. I would really like to see demonstration flights of Heli's, 3-D and/or Pattern, Scale, maybe Warbirds around imaginary pylons, some Sam's and an Electric flight. A Jet would be great. If we have a volunteer, we might take the club Nexstar and do a few intro flights. We can probably set up a joint transportation arrangement for the trip.

The first Float Fly is a month earlier, to allow for the lower lake level conditions that occur later in the summer. Tom R will host this event. I have just put together an electric 20 inch model of a Cris Craft runabout that I hope will serve as a retriever this year. Actually, it is an exact same model as the one that Mary used to run (on fuel) back in Grand Island in the 50's, except that no one had invented ARF's back then, and had to use 27mc with compound escapements.

The Carson City Airport Open House will be as in the past, a booth with as many ships as possible on display, and

hopefully great raffle ticket sales. If the fella that did the demonstration last year does not show up this year, I would like to have one of our members do one.

We will need someone to volunteer to host the Float Fly #2. Volunteers need to speak up or these events will just disappear. We will attempt to announce any cancellations (due to no volunteers) at least a week in advance.

The Annual Scale Contest, this year a Static Scale / Flying Scale contest, will run two days on the same weekend. Mr. T has agreed to host the annual Open House event. We would like to see demo flights of Warbirds (two if possible) 3-D, Heli, Pattern, Old Timers, Electric, Jet, and Scale if possible. We will be contacting you for support in this. We will also be offering introductory flights again this year.

A new event this year will be a day devoted to electric powered models only. I guess that even we old timers have to admit the electrics are here to stay, and may possibly take over RC flight someday.

The Old Timers event will be held in conjunction with a normal day's open field flying. Simply an opportunity to show off your old birds.

The Sept Warbirds will be a non-competitive day to crank up one of your Warbirds, and even play with the pylons if you want. I will endeavor to host this one.

We have set Sept 20<sup>th</sup> as the Annual Picnic/Club Raffle day. As usual, great food, refreshments, and lots of flying for a whole day. If you know a good preacher, you might try to arrange the weather for this one.

The officers hope that these events will meet with more enthusiasm than some of those last year, and provide great fun for all.
