Also has some great features, like being able to set the servo speed on almost all channels. There is no engine kill function, but the throttle trim has enough travel to close the throttle instead.

Had an interesting meeting with some city officials on the 21<sup>st</sup>. Seems that the director of parks and recreation, Roger Moellendorf, a Donna Curtiss whom appears to be Scott Fahrenbruch's supervisor, suggested that Scott call a meeting between themselves, Ken S and myself. I suggested that the safety officer should be included if that was the subject of the meeting, so Tom H attended also. Turned out the meeting was regarding the upcoming VT railroad and any future condo development in regards to the Pony Express Park Operation.

The outcome of the meeting seemed to be that there are two possible solutions, and will be one amendment to our lease contract. The lease will be amended to remove all liabilities to the club in the event of an incident caused by a non-club member participant. The possible solutions to the VT train appear to be either closing of the aircraft portion of the Park to non club members, with the members policing activities among approved users of the park, or the possible relocation of the road, tables, sun shades and storage building to the north side of the runway, and the actual flight area moved to the south side of the runway. The city is looking into both the costs of the move, and the feasibility of closing the field to members only, which they don't really care to do.

Tom R is reminding me of the Chowcilla event over Memorial weekend. Sounds like this could be a real fun event, with not too long a drive involved.

And then there is the Model Expo down in Pomona Cal in April (19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup>). A bigger blowout, but of course a lot further away.

The Sacramento auction is also scheduled for the 19<sup>th</sup>.

By now Ken should have the club Nexstar airworthy, as well as trimmed out. I understand that Kyle already has one student signed up for lessons with it.

And speaking (or is that writing?) of Ken, please remember folks, we do need a local hobby shop. I know that I mentioned this last year, but I would really be very unhappy if I have to drive to Reno for every tube of glue or sheet of balsa.
