
(2) Results of field test conducted on September 6th and 7th•

Background: During the past twelve years of field use I have seen a number of problems as a result of pilots flying from the pit area. A large number of pilots fly from the openings in the pit fence due to height of the fence. There is missed communication between pilots due to noise from the pit area, and a large number of members dislike landing to the East due to poor runway visibility in that direction. Large airplanes parked along the fence in the pilot area causing pilots to lose concentration as they move along the fence. I am sure there are other issues I have missed.

By moving the pilot flying area away from the pits, closer to the runway we address these problems. The runway site picture is unobstructed in both directions; pilot communication is greatly enhanced due to closer proximity and less pit noise. This should also provide a better environment for flight training. By holding the fence height to 36" there will be no antenna issues. The proposed .flying areas will also be ideal for club contests as judges will be in a protected area free of obstructions.

On the 6^{th} and 7^{th} of September a field test was conducted at the field with pilots flying from the proposed locations. The results of that test with the pilot's names and comments are included herewith. As noted these comments were very positive on the change.

I would submit that this proposal be published, with enclosures in the October newsletter, and that the matter be considered for a vote at the October meeting.

The year is coming to an end. Not much going on except the Club Christmas Dinner and election of officers. There's going to be some vacancies this year to fill, so start thinking about whom you want to elect as officers. Here is a list of officers and their duties from the Club's By-Laws;

President. The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Club presiding at all regular membership meetings and board of directors meetings. He shall appoint all committees not provided for in these bylaws and shall have power and authority to sign contracts, deeds and other legal documents on behalf of the Club. The President shall have the authority to appoint officers to fill vacancies that occur between annual elections.

Vice President. The Vice President shall assist the President in planning programs and other activities as requested by the President, and in the absence of the President, shall preside at meetings. In addition, the Vice President shall control the annual and monthly raffles and the planning of the Christmas party.

Secretary. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the regular meetings. The Secretary shall have custody of the records pertinent to this office.

Treasurer. The Treasurer shall keep full and complete records pertaining to the funds of the corporation. He shall deposit funds in the institution designated by the Board of Directors. The Treasurer shall pay out money as authorized by the Board of Directors. He shall present a Treasurer's Report at every regular membership meeting.

Field Marshall. The Field Marshall shall be responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of the corporation's flying field with particular emphasis placed on safety. From time to time the Field Marshall may call for working parties and/or individuals to help in his duties.

Safety Officer. The Safety Officer shall be responsible for insuring that all flying and events at the flying field are

carried out in a safe and sane manner. Members and guests shall be warned of unsafe maneuvers and, with persistent violations of field rules, shall be recommended for revocation of flying privileges. The Safety Officer and other officers of the corporation have the authority to issue on field warnings to individuals compromising safety. The Safety Officer, from time to time, shall submit safety articles to the Newsletter Editor for publication.

Newsletter Editor. The Newsletter Editor shall publish the corporation's newsletter one week prior to the regular meetings. Articles of interest for the education and edification of the members shall have priority for publication. Annually and as required a complete roster of members shall be published.

I also think it worthwhile to include the Purpose of the club's existence, also from the By-Laws;

This non-profit corporation is formed to promote education in the science of aeronautics and to enhance knowledge in the art of aviation through the development of building and flying skills utilizing model radio controlled aircraft. This program targets all ages. Young people particularly are helped as they explore aviation as a field of career potential. Additionally, the senior population is benefited through the exercise of fine motor skills, complex problem solving and utilization of physical reactions. No member of this non-profit corporation shall acquire pecuniary gain or profit of any kind from association with the High Sierra Radio Control Club.

Our congratulations also go out to Jim Giffin, our new VP of District X. Good luck in your new position!
