








Carson City Airport Open House continued

I was out at the field running up the Saito 115 in my CAP Maniac on the starter table. Got it too lean and it backfired. Did not loosen the spinner BUT threw off both prop blades. Snapped them off about an inch out from the spinner and threw the blades about 5 feet forward and about 20 feet sideways. Might be a good idea to remind everyone to NOT stand to the side of and line with a running propeller. Don Morse
